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Objectives:

Process of making a Complaint:

If employee believes that he/she is being, or has been, harassed, he/she is to follow the procedure as mentioned below:

• Contact employee's supervisor or Head of Department for support

• The employee can give a written complaint to any member of GGC/ICC or put a written complaint in GGC drop box which is opened by GGC chairperson and secretary on first day of every month.

Receiving a Complaint:

ICC/GGC on receiving complaint will form enquiry committee and

- Listen to the complaint seriously
- Treat the complaint confidentially and on its merit.
- Allow the complainant to bring another person to the interview if he/she chooses to
- Ask the complainant for the full story, including what happened step by step
- Take notes, using the complainant's own words
- Ask the complainant to check notes & sign so as to ensure record of the conversation is accurate
- Explain and agree the next course of action with the complainant
- Submit detailed report with signed statements of both complainant and respondent along with recommendations to Head of Institution.

- Ragging needs to be perceived as failure to inculcate human values from the schooling stage.
- Behavioural patterns among students, particularly potential 'raggers' need to be checked
- 6. Measures against ragging must deter its recurrence
- 7. Media and the Civil Society should be involved in this exercise.

Activities:

The objective of this committee is to create ragging free environment in the campus. To facilitate this objective various activities are carried out. The details are given below.

- 02/12/2021: Following interpersonal issues among residents, Antiragging committee conducted meeting of all Antiragging committee members to discuss the antiragging measures.
- 2. 27/12/21: Dr. Kajal Mitra, Dean & Chairman, Antiragging committee & Dr. Sushil Gawande, Member Secretary, Antiragging committee conducted session for the resident doctors in the department of surgery to improve interpersonal relationship.
- 3. 29/03/2022: As per the guidelines by MUHS Nashik "Antiragging Hoardings" were placed at all the crucial places of the campus.
- 4. 01/04/2022: Dr. Vilas Thombre, Vice Dean & Co-Chairman, Antiragging committee addressed the first MBBS students and their parents regarding issues of ragging and preventive measures.
- 5. 13/04/2022: Undertakings given by newly admitted MBBS student and their parents were reviewed and summarized report was sent to the registrar, MUHS, Nashik.
- 28/04/2022: Antiragging committee called meeting of all the members and various issues like accommodation of first MBBS students, security system, hostel rounds of teachers etc were discussed.
- 7. 06/05/2022: Dr. Kajal Mitra, Dean & Chairman, Antiragging committee & Dr. Sushil Gawande, Member Secretary addressed residents of department of Medicine regarding interpersonal relationship.
- 8. 06/06/2022: All the MBBS students (I/II/III/IV) and their parents are reminded through circular to fill the antiragging undertaking available on portal www.antiragging.in
- 29/06/2022: Dr. Sushil Gawande, Member Secretary Antiragging Committee submitted the online compliance report of Antiragging committee to the UGC.
- 10. 01/07/2022: Letters are sent by email to the parents of students who are recently passed first MBBS. In this letters parents are requested to communicate antiragging measures with their wards and also to motivate them to be cordial with the newly admitted students.
