
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
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

- c) What percentage of teachers are effectively communicating domain knowledge using IT skills and Soft skills in the Teaching-Learning Process?
- d) Do the teachers build-up the expected curricular competencies, program outcomes and course outcomes in you?
- e) Does your mentor follow up necessarily on the tasks assigned to you?
- f) To what extent mentoring process in your institution beneficial to you for cognitive, social and emotional growth?
- g) To what extent clinical and practical facilities related to your discipline have been made available to you?
- h) To what extent of training are provided, in the skill and simulation labs, clinical ward rounds/rotations and lab exercises related to your discipline?
- i) What percentage of teachers use ICT-enabled methods like multimedia, web-based learning and national eresources while teaching?
- j) What is the extent of opportunities given to you for outdoor learning like internship, student exchanges, field visits and projects?

- k) Does the institution provide opportunities for experimental learning, including problem-based learning, case-based learning, evidence-based learning, competency building, seminars, seminars, group discussions, to enhance knowledge and skills in your discipline?

- v) If you were to award rating for your institution in terms of "stars" in relation to quality of teaching, learning and evaluation, what would be your rating?


Overall combined Student Satisfaction Reponses of few statements are as follows:































Few of the suggestions given by the students to improve the overall teaching, learning and evaluation process were:
