


### COLLEGE STUDENTS' COUNCIL 2025-26 organised Open Mic- literature Club on 7th August 2025

*High-Fidelity Heroes: Leveraging Technology for Clinical Excellence* Simulation in medical education is crucial for providing a safe, risk-free environment for healthcare professionals to practice complex clinical skills, manage emergencies, and develop teamwork, leading to improved patient safety and better clinical outcomes, bridging the gap between theory and real-world practice through deliberate practice and realistic scenarios. It allows repetition, immediate feedback, and exposure to rare events, fostering confidence and competence without patient harm, essential for modern medical training.

**Key Reasons for the Importance of Simulation are:**  
The primary importance of simulation is that it removes the learning curve from real patients. Trainees can make and learn from mistakes without causing harm, which is a critical step in reducing medical errors and improving patient outcomes. Simulation allows for deliberate, hands-on practice of technical skills (e.g., Intubation, suturing, catheterization) until proficiency is achieved. This repetition ensures skills are retained effectively. Medical students and residents may not encounter certain high-stakes emergencies or rare conditions during their standard clinical rotations. Simulation can replicate these scenarios, ensuring all trainees are prepared to handle them effectively when they eventually occur in real life.

Simulation provides consistent and standardized training experiences, unlike traditional clinical training where patient cases can vary. This standardization is beneficial for fair and objective assessment of learner competencies across institutions.

Practicing in a risk-free, supportive environment helps build learner confidence and reduces anxiety associated with transitioning to real patient care.

A core component of simulation is the structured debriefing session that follows the scenario. This allows for immediate, constructive feedback and reflection on actions, which is essential for reinforcing learning and correcting errors.

In essence, simulation-based medical education is an ethical imperative that moves medical training from the traditional "See One, Do One, Teach One" model to a safer "See One, Practice Many, Do One" model.

Lecture on Mammography, Sonomammography & BIRADS May 10, 2025

Breast imaging was the theme of this well-attended lecture, delivered by Dr. Hatgaokar and departmental faculty. The lecture included technical aspects of mammography and sonomammography, followed by a detailed explanation of the BI-RADS classification system. Through illustrative cases, participants learned to grade lesions and report findings with clarity and confidence. The faculty ensured that PG students developed a practical understanding of how imaging findings translate into patient care decisions.

International Webinar on Adnexal Masses May 18, 2025

One of the highlights of the quarter was an international webinar jointly organized with Gynac.org and GE HealthCare. With participation from global experts including the eminent Prof. Lil Valentin, the session focused on ultrasound-based evaluation of adnexal masses. Clinical case presentations were integrated into the lecture, making the learning practical and dynamic. The international exposure broadened the perspective of our residents and provided them an opportunity to interact with world leaders in gynecological imaging.

Level-II Course in Colour Doppler June 19 & 22, 2025

The Radiology Skill Academy Nagpur (RSAN) hosted a four-day intensive training program exclusively on Color Doppler studies. The course was structured into didactic lectures, live demonstrations, and extensive hands-on scanning sessions. Trainees practiced Doppler evaluation of carotid, renal, portal, and peripheral vessels under close faculty guidance. With pre- and post-tests included, participants were able to measure their learning outcomes objectively. The certification provided added value to their academic portfolio.

Case-Based Guest Lectures June 21 & 22, 2025

Dr. Varsha Rangankar, known for her exam-oriented teaching approach, conducted a series of case-based lectures. Students were presented with radiological images from common and uncommon clinical scenarios, mimicking real examination conditions. The sessions emphasized quick but accurate diagnosis, differential considerations, and structured reporting.

Fetal Echo & Neurosonogram Workshop July 18 & 20, 2025

This national-level, three-day simulator-based workshop attracted participants from various parts of India. Led by Dr. Sunil Kabra and team, the workshop offered a unique opportunity to practice fetal echocardiography and neurosonography using high-end simulators. Participants rotated through stations, practiced real-time scanning, and received immediate feedback from faculty. The workshop concluded with participant evaluation and certification, ensuring skill acquisition in these critical subspecialties.

Online Course in Practical Neuroradiology Reporting July 13 & August 10, 2025

A focused online course led by experts including Dr. Hemant Sonwalkar, this program aimed at making postgraduate students confident in neuroradiology reporting. The topics included stroke, tumors, trauma, hydrocephalus, and epilepsy, with emphasis on a systematic approach to image interpretation. Students were guided on how to draft structured reports, highlight clinically relevant findings, and correlate imaging with patient presentation. The virtual format allowed wide participation and provided access to leading neuroradiologists.

OBGY USG Simulator Training Course August 2023, 2025

The academic quarter concluded with a highly practical four-day OBGY ultrasound simulator course. Residents received extensive hands-on practice in fetal biometry, anomaly detection, growth assessment, and transvaginal imaging. Expert faculty supervised each station, providing real-time feedback and mentoring. This course not only reinforced theoretical knowledge but also instilled confidence in performing independent scans, preparing residents for real-world clinical practice.
